Annual Review

The year 2024/2025 has been one of remarkable expansion and deepened impact for our charity. Building on the strong foundation of past years, we have continued to grow programs that empower individuals and strengthen our community connections.

This year marked the successful launch of Women Rising, a year-long series dedicated to advancing women's leadership through empowerment, skill-building, and community engagement. Over the course of ten inspiring events—including our launch, sessions on women in politics and economic growth, workshops on assertiveness, networking and communication, building strong communities, personal branding, advocating for social change, launching ventures, and culminating in the Breaking Barriers celebration.

Our social enterprise, Thrift & Fund, entered its second year of operation and has quickly become both a community hub and a steady source of funding for our programs. With the support of 100 dedicated volunteers, the store has flourished as more than just a retail space—it is a living classroom where interns, work experience participants, and volunteers build practical skills in retail, customer service, and cashiering, while finding belonging in a diverse and supportive team.

We also proudly launched Thrift & Thrive, our youth internship program. This initiative has opened doors for young people to gain hands-on work experience, develop leadership skills, and receive mentorship that prepares them for their next steps with confidence.

Reflecting on this year, we are profoundly grateful to our community, volunteers, and supporters who make this work possible. Looking ahead, we are filled with excitement for what's next. With compassion, collaboration, and a shared vision, we will continue to expand our impact and build a future where every person has the tools and community they need to thrive.

WOMEN RISING

In its first year, Women Rising brought together women and allies across ten inspiring events designed to advance women's leadership. From the launch celebration to the finale Breaking Barriers, each gathering created space for learning, dialogue, and connection.

THRIFT & FUND

Now in its second year of operation, Thrift & Fund has blossomed into more than just a store—it is a vibrant hub for community connection and a steady source of funding for Low Entropy programs. The store is made possible by the dedication of 100 volunteers who give their time, skills, and heart to this work.

Each day, volunteers, interns, and work experience participants learn about retail, customer service, and cashiering, gaining valuable skills that prepare them for future opportunities. For many, Thrift & Fund is their first introduction to the workforce, and the supportive environment makes it a place where confidence and capacity grow.

Our diverse team reflects the richness of our community—people of all ages, backgrounds, and experiences working side by side. Together, they keep the store thriving and welcoming to every customer who walks through the doors. With each sale, Thrift & Fund directly supports our programs, proving that every purchase has a purpose.

THRIFT & THRIVE

This year, we proudly launched Thrift & Thrive, our youth internship program designed to empower young people through hands-on learning and mentorship. Participants engaged in retail training, leadership workshops, and mentorship sessions that prepared them for both employment and personal growth.

The program built practical skills such as cashiering, customer service, and teamwork, while also fostering leadership qualities like communication, confidence, and collaboration. By combining real-world experience with reflective learning, Thrift & Thrive gave youth a unique pathway to success.

Participants expressed that the program not only strengthened their resumes but also gave them a sense of community and belonging. As Thrift & Thrive grows, it will continue to open doors for youth to step into their futures with readiness and resilience.

VOICES OF THE MATRIARCHS

This year we advanced several initiatives rooted in cultural revitalization, healing, and housing justice. In January 2025, we launched Voices of the Matriarchs, a project revitalizing traditional practices and celebrating Indigenous matriarchal leadership. Its goals are to strengthen cultural identity, foster intergenerational knowledge transfer, and restore community belonging through ceremonies, mentorship, and the creation of significant cultural belongings. The project is already off to a strong start for the next fiscal year



SACRED CIRCLES



We also began Sacred Circles in November 2024, an Indigenous-led Family Violence Prevention Program. Through seven seminars and workshops on healthy relationships and prevention, healing circles offering safe spaces for sharing, three traditional healing sessions, a cultural camp, three Elder teachings, landbased learning, and a community-wide gathering, Sacred Circles strengthened cultural identity, increased awareness, built skills, and enhanced the well-being and resilience of Indigenous individuals.

CONNECTING COMMUNITIES



IN JANUARY 2025, WE EMBARKED ON CREATING AN AFFORDABLE HOUSING STRATEGIC PLAN THROUGH AN INDIGENOUS CULTURAL LENS. THIS AMBITIOUS EFFORT POSITIONS US TO BECOME A NON-PROFIT AFFORDABLE HOUSING PROVIDER DEDICATED TO OFFERING ACCESSIBLE, CULTURALLY INTEGRATED HOUSING SOLUTIONS FOR THOSE EXPERIENCING OR AT RISK OF HOMELESSNESS IN THE TRI-CITIES. BY ENGAGING PEOPLE WITH LIVED EXPERIENCE, INDIGENOUS LEADERS, AND COMMUNITY PARTNERS, WE ARE DESIGNING A HOLISTIC MODEL THAT COMBINES HOUSING WITH WRAPAROUND SUPPORTS SUCH AS MENTAL HEALTH, ADDICTION RECOVERY, AND EMPLOYMENT SERVICES. WE ANTICIPATE SHARING THIS STRATEGIC PLAN WITH COMMUNITIES IN 2026.




EDITH
